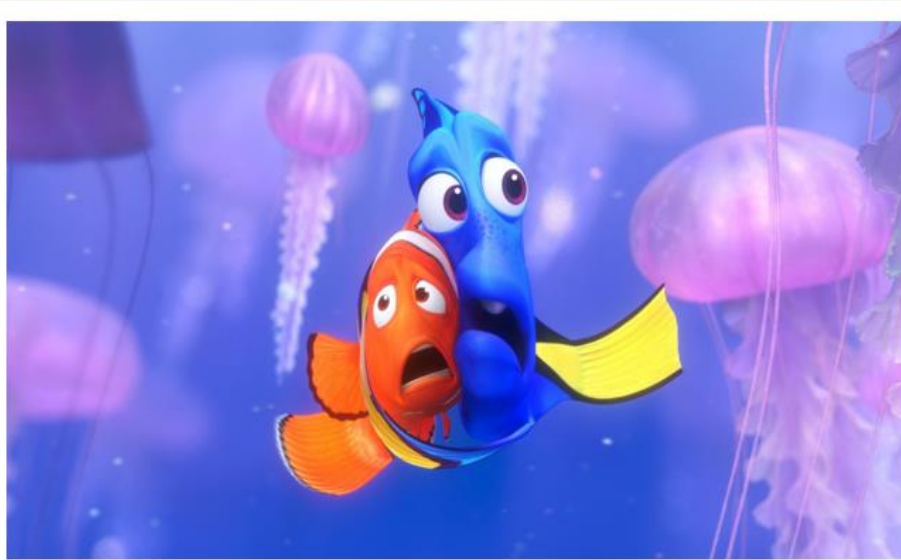
What event do you think is happening in the photo? Why?

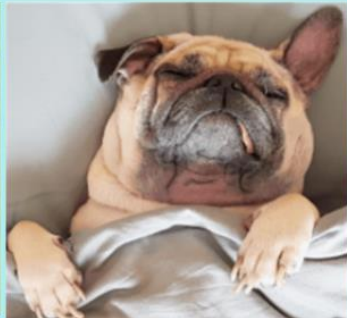


“Dory is feeling sad.”
